

## Bills Scored for 2018 Legislative Scorecard

### **SB 1146/HB 2166 Vehicle License Tax – Club Opposed**

Sponsors: Senator Bob Worsley; Rep. Noel Campbell

Bill gave authority to the director of the Department of Transportation to set vehicle license taxes.

### **SB 1273 Governor Regulatory Review Council; Occupational Licensing – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Senator Warren Petersen

Allows an individual whose profession's average salary does not exceed 200 percent of the federal poverty level to petition GRRC to review a non-statutory rule, regulation, or occupational licensing requirement they believe to be overly burdensome.

### **HB 2238 Administrative Deference – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Eddie Farnsworth

Gives regulated members of the state a fair chance to overturn a bad agency ruling in court by not allowing a judge to defer to the agencies application and interpretation of the law.

### **SB 1436 Criminal History; Occupational Licensing – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Senator Judy Burges

Prohibits agencies and boards from denying an occupational license to a person with a criminal history unless that person committed a violent or sexual crime, or the crime is related to the profession sought.

### **SB 1377/HB 2235 Dental Therapy – Club Supported**

Sponsors: Senator Nancy Barto; Rep. Bob Thorpe

Allows for dental therapists (mid-tier dental provider) to practice at a federally qualified community health center, at a nonprofit dental practice that serves low-income and underserved people, and/or at a private dental practice that serves patients referred by a community health center.

### **HB 2568 Affordable Housing Tax Credit – Club Opposed (Only scored for House members)**

Sponsor: Rep. Tony Rivero

Mirrored a failed federal affordable housing tax credit program in Arizona.

### **HB 2457 Corporation Commission Fee Authority; Incorporations – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Jill Norgaard

Eliminated authority from the Corporation Commission to charge a fee to publish new business incorporation articles.

### **HCR 2007 Clean Elections; Money for Political Parties – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Doug Coleman

If passed by voters this November, would stop the Clean Elections Commission's practice of allowing candidates to funnel taxpayer dollars into political parties.

### **HB 2579/SB 1140 Video Service Providers; Local Preemption – Club Supported**

Sponsors: Rep. Jill Norgaard; Senator Gail Griffin

Bill gave authority to the director of the Department of Transportation to set vehicle license taxes.

### **HB 2528 Capital Gains Tax – Club Supported (Only scored for House members)**

Sponsor: Rep. Javan Mesnard

Would have increased the capital gains deduction from its current level at 25 percent to 50 percent by 2023.

### **SB 1404/HB 2532 Occupational Licensing; City Preemption – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Senator Steve Smith; Rep. Kevin Payne

Requires cities and towns to hold a public hearing for a new licensure and prove a nexus of public health and safety and sunsets current local occupational licenses five years out and requires a public hearing to demonstrate necessity.

### **HB 2333/SB 1387 Home Based Business; Regulations – Club Supported (Only scored for House members)**

Sponsors: Rep. Jeff Weninger; Senator Gail Griffin

Preempts cities and counties from licensing home-based businesses that qualified as “no impact.”

### **HB 2604 Consolidated Elections – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Javan Mesnard

Requires local cities and towns to consolidate their elections if its previous elections on a non-statewide election resulted in a voter turnout of less than 25 percent of the election held in the same jurisdiction for the most recent election where the Governor was on the ballot.

### **HB 2434 Fintech Sandbox – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Jeff Weninger

Creates an Arizona “sandbox” for developing new innovative Fin-Tech companies.

### **HB 2479/SB 1392 Digital Goods and Services Tax – Club Supported (Only scored for House members)**

Sponsors: Senator David Farnsworth; Rep. Michelle Ugenti-Rita

Resolves ambiguity as to what digital goods and services are taxable under state law.

### **SB 1390/HB 2158 Extension of 301 Tax – Club Opposed**

Sponsors: Senator Kate Brophy McGee; Rep. Doug Coleman

Extended the 6/8ths sales tax (Prop 301) for education funding.

### **SB 1147 County Excise Tax – Club Opposed (Only scored for Senate members)**

Sponsors: Senator Bob Worsley; Rep. Noel Campbell

Bill gave authority to the director of the Department of Transportation to set vehicle license taxes.

### **HB 2153 Donor Privacy – Club Supported**

Sponsor: Rep. Vince Leach

Further clarified state law pre-empting local governments from passing their own donor harassment ordinances that infringe on groups constitutional right to privacy and freedom of association.
